





"The newly-discovered Lake Ngami, was reached by a route that had always been deemed impracticable. It is more than probable that this route (the shortest and best) will be adopted as the one by which commerce and civilization may eventually find their way to the Lake regions." (Preface).





Burbridge's narrative includes remarks on Chinese settlers, gambling, head-hunting, river-side gardening, coal mining, tropical fruits, wild animals, manners and customs of the natives, the Sultan Moumein, a royal boar-hunt with the Sultan of the Sulus, notes on tropical travel, &c., as well as descriptions of plant-hunting". 



On the way to the North Pacific the voyagers touched at the Sandwich Islands ... later called the Hawaiian Islands, where Cook met his death on his return from the North" (Cox). A folded copperplate in vol. III shows the scene in which Cook comes to his death. The drawing was made according to eyewitnesses. The included engraved plates were all made especially for the octavo edition, as indicated by the engraved text at the upper margin of the plates. Some of the engravings were made by John Webber (1751-1793), who was the official expedition painter of the third voyage.



He writes in the preface: "I was not blind to the fact that the trip required more perfect knowledge of the necessary routes than could be obtained by a simple glance at the guide-books of Murray or of Baedeker, which might suffice for an excursion amongst the Alps, or for a tour in Italy". Sabin 683 – First edition of Antonio de Alcedos (1735-1812) translation of the historic-geographical dictionary for America and the West-Indies by George Alexander Thompson (1783-?), which was first published between 1786-89 in Madrid as "Diccionario geográfico-histórico de las Indias Occidentales ó América: es á saber: de los reynos del Perú, Nueva España, Tierra Firme, Chile, y Nuevo reyno de Granada". "Thompson's edition for its additions etc. is infinitely superior to the original" (Sabin). With a printed dedication to Nicholas Vansittart (1766-1851), who encouraged Thompsons work: "The work was undertaken six yerars ago, when I was only twenty-three years old, and has ever since been the chief employment of those hours which the necessary attendance of my office has left at my disposal."
